

Knowledge Hub Logic Model:

Inputs:

Qualified personnel and resources providing the following:

1. Organization and coordination of a Community of Practice
2. Gathering information from researchers and community organizations involved in trauma-informed health services research for survivors of domestic violence and child abuse
3. Outreach to health and social service providers, researchers and policy-makers beyond the PHAC projects
4. Expertise and consultation in the development of common indicators

Outputs:

Activities:

1. Community of Practice virtual meetings/ teleconferences
2. Knowledge Exchanges
3. Webinars

Products:

1. Minutes of virtual meetings/ teleconferences
2. Proceedings from Knowledge Exchanges, reports
3. Quarterly newsletters, Web portal, Social media posts, Infographics, Charts, Factsheets
4. Database of researchers
5. Indicators literature review (academic), Indicators literature review (plain language), Common set of indicators

Outcomes:

Short term:

1. New relationships created between relevant researchers and community organizations
2. Skills and knowledge are shared and developed
3. Researchers and community organizations involved in PHAC call for proposals are aware of common indicators that can be used for their projects

Medium-term:

1. Researchers and community organizations are aware of who they can partner with on what topic in the future in order to improve health outcomes for survivors
2. Researchers and community organizations apply new skills and knowledge to their work in the area of trauma-informed services for domestic violence and child abuse survivors
3. PHAC-funded projects adopt common indicators to improve accountability for public funds and measure impacts in a comparative way, so most effective interventions can be identified and used as models

Long-term:

1. Health outcomes of people who have experienced domestic violence and child abuse are improved

Assumptions:

1. PHAC-funded projects will want to participate in the Knowledge Hub.

External Factors:

1. Time constraints and other priorities may impede full participation of projects in the Knowledge Hub.
